- 1:20pm While waiting for quorum, the Council President allowed a presentation to be provided by Mr. Roy Dempsey, Community Relations Outreach Specialist with Tsehotsooi Medical Center. Topic of Presentation: Hantavirus
 - o Symptoms of Hantavirus, types of virus from the different species of mice.
 - o Minimize contact with mice; ensure there are no spaces around windows or openings the size of diameter of a pen. The mice can fit through those openings to make their way into homes. The best thing to use to fill the small round holes is steel wool.
 - o The use of the mouse traps is more efficient. If glue boards are used to trap mice, once they are trapped, they will urinate or drop more feces while struggling to come loose.
 - o The best storage containers to use are glass or tight sealing containers.
 - If you come across a nest, remove the container from the home or storage shed. If you
 remove the items from the container, the small particles will be released in the air where
 you will inhale it.
 - Clorox is still the best solution to use by using a 9 to 1 ratio, wear rubber gloves and a mask.
 When disposing the nested items, place items in a plastic bag and place the first bag into another bag double bagging the items.
 - o If you start to feel ill, go to your nearest health facility. Make sure you tell the physician what you did prior to your illness

Topic of Presentation: Measles-

- The Measles is VERY contagious.
- When you go into the hospital for follow-up ask the nursing staff if your Immunization is up to date.

 - o Tsehotsooii Medical Center does not have any funding for Clorox.

1. Business Report March 2024: Ms. Alfreda Earle, Chapter Manager

ED Agancy Council was hold vectorday and our Council Secretary / Transurar Sharon Smith				

- FD Agency Council was held yesterday and our Council Secretary/Treasurer Sharon Smith attended. She brought back information from NDOT regarding the Sunrise Low Water Crossing and N15 Reconstruction Project.
- CLUPC Manual Update She has attempted to push the CLUPC to update the CLUPC Manual, but nothing has been done and going on 2 years. Last week RDC met at Greasewood Chapter and it was announced that Klagetoh Chapter had their Manual approved.
- Chapter Operation: Chapter is open 8a-5pm. They continue to sell hay and water. The Laundromat was reopened. Stock water was recleaned on Friday April 12, 2024 and they will re-open to provide livestock water beginning tomorrow April 15, 2024.
- The Emergency Declaration is still in effect. They provided emergency wood and food.
- The Chapter encourages the community to prepare for the winter weather. Some community members can get upset about the amount of assistance provided. The Chapter does all they can to assist community members even to deliver wood if they ask.
- The Chapter continues to provide water to families who need water that do not currently have running water.
- April 22, 2024 Earth Week. There will an extra bin and provide water, trash bags and gloves. The community is requested to assist with trash pickup along the roads, County, BIA and N15. April 26th, the Chapter will provide lunch for participants.
- ARPA funding and projects. In January 2024; the chapter received half of the award.

- March 28th The chapter held interviews for the Home Renovation Project. The selected candidates started on 04/09/24. They were to begin on 04/08/24, but due to the Solar Eclipse they were sent home to begin the following day. Orientation was held on Tuesday, April 09, 2024. The Chapter decided to start at the farthest residents. By Friday 04/12/24 they have made 25 assessments. This project will be a 1 ½ year project. There are 125 applicants thus far.
- Food Assistance Program quarterly. The first assistance will be for 125 families. This will be projected to occur in about 2 weeks.
- Septic Cleaning The chapter was taking names and compiled a list. This list was forwarded to EPA. 140 names from the community was forwarded to EPA.
- Heating Source Project wood, wood pellet and propane assistance. Held an application drive. All sources were separated. They have sent out quotes, but the vendors are very slow to respond.
- Bathroom Additions is another project, another heavy equipment purchase and Scholarship Assistance are additional projects under ARPA.
- There was another ARPA project for powerline extension to Navajo Station, but ARPA funded NTUA for the project separately, so the \$225,000.00 will be used for bathroom addition construction and labor.
- Navajo Mine Heating heating resource ended at the end of March 2024.
- Election is coming up Chapter Officials. The primary Election will be held on July 30, 2024. Opening day for Candidate filing will be April 25, 2024.
- Registering to Vote has to done in person, application cannot be taken for individuals not present.
- Moving forward, her main goal is to continue to report all ARPA expenditure.
- ARPA expenditure will be submitted monthly.
- Navajo Nation Council will begin their Spring Session tomorrow 04/05/24.
- They attended a staff meeting with ASC in Teesto, Az. As of yesterday, the resolution submission to allow Virtual Attendance of Meetings is at 13 chapters. Some of the Chapters are still struggling to encumber funds for their ARPA projects due to the documents required for submission.
